# COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

## **COURSE 1:** Outreach & Engagement for Survivors of Sexual Violence

In this session we will explore how to effectively engage individuals who have experienced sexual violence—whether recently or in the past—and how to design and deliver outreach that reduces barriers to help-seeking. We will cover strategies to raise awareness, build trust, reduce stigma, adapt to different populations (age, culture, gender, sexual orientation, ability), and create partnership networks for referral and coordination.

## **COURSE 2:** Navigating Trauma with Care: A Trauma-Informed, Victim-Centered Service Delivery Approach

This session focuses on how to deliver direct support services in a way that honors survivors' needs, preserves their agency, mitigates re-traumatization, and fosters empowerment. We will cover trauma-informed care principles, the neurobiology and impact of sexual violence, best practices for communication, assessment, referral, safety planning, and support. Participants will also explore how to partner across disciplines (advocacy, medical, legal, mental health) and how to integrate culturally responsive and inclusive practices.

## **COURSE 3:** Supporting Male Survivors of Domestic & Sexual Violence

This session is dedicated to the often-overlooked population of male survivors of domestic violence and/or sexual violence. We will address the unique challenges they face, including stigma, gender norms, under-recognition, shame, and limited-service infrastructure. Participants will learn how to adapt outreach, engagement, and service-delivery practices to ensure that male survivors receive effective, inclusive, trauma-informed support. The session also explores how to ensure organizational readiness for inclusive services, language, policies, and collaboration.

## **COURSE 4:** Meeting Survivors Where They Are - Culturally Responsive Support & Outreach for Victims of Sexual Violence

Participants will explore how culture, identity, and lived experience influence survivors' healing journeys and their willingness to seek help. The session will emphasize the importance of implementing culturally relevant, anti-oppressive, and community-driven approaches that respect each survivor's unique context and promote equitable access to healing resources.
